Weekly Letter - 14 July 2024

Ephesians 2:11-22

Fellow-Citizens and Family

We all need a sense of belonging. We all want to feel valued. And we require meaning and purpose to give shape to our lives. I like Augustine's prayer, 'You have made us for yourself O Lord & our heart is restless until it rests in you.' We belong to God. God gives us value and dignity beyond measure. And being part of God's mission means that whatever we do when we act in faith becomes part of God's eternal purpose.

The letter to the Ephesians gives us that sense of belonging, worth and purpose: we are fellow citizens of God's people and members of the family of God (2:19). That comes through God's grace, a free gift of love, which gives us a basis for a life of good deeds (2:8-10). We have peace with God and each other through Jesus, his preaching and his dying on the cross.

The passage focuses on the perceived differences between Jews and Gentiles in their relations to God and uses the image of the Jerusalem Temple and the way it was divided by walls into courts that separated people. Jesus breaks down the dividing walls, which has resonance with the gospel accounts of the curtain separating off the Holy of Holies being torn from top to bottom (Mark 15:38). Jesus makes one people and 'In union with him you too are being built together with all the others into a place where God lives through his Spirit.' (2:22), which is similar to being built into a temple of 'living stones' (1 Pet 2:4). The people rather than the place become the focus for encountering God. It's no surprise that 'no longer strangers' (2:19) became a phrase for the ecumenical movement working for unity.

Take a moment to give thanks for belonging to Christ Well. Rest in knowing that you are loved by God and a valued member of God's family. Pray that God will give you opportunities to show the Spirit lives in us.
