The mystery of the Divine Kingdom

Just for a moment, think of yourself standing on a soap-box, (which can be fun!), and begin to explain to the people around you how a monumental and completely new Kingdom could come about. What would you focus on? A hugely powerful and wealthy family/dynasty, a gigantic army, a colossal and towering personality, or perhaps you would concentrate on a cataclysmic event?

You of course know how Jesus explains how God's Kingdom will come about!

Reading Jesus' explanation feels like he is thinking out loud, so let's hear again what he is trying to express to you.

"I know what resources and assets my Father has to create the new and promised Kingdom. I understand that to you, the creation of this Kingdom often seems to be rather vague and nebulous! You are also baffled by a teeny-weeny seed and how it silently and almost imperceptibly sprouts and grows into a beautiful plant or fruit! Well, this is the way my Father brings about the Kingdom!"

Jesus continues, 'I also realize that often God my Father is a mystery to you, (one of the reasons I came down from heaven!). So it's not easy for you to perceive the way he works, or even notice the causes of change. You need to keep in mind, 'this is divine work!'

Now you might be thinking, well, if this is the way He works, you are surplus to requirements! Most definitely not. That will never be the case, for if you do not put your faith in God's future, your world will be poorer and more cramped. But what you do know about seeds is that they need watering, weeding and fertilizing, and therefore you need to continue to grow in holiness, love, faith and hope, as that will give you great joy. So never forget, that God my Father is at work, for 'He is making a road in the desert and rivers in wastelands'.

So hold tight, use each day to seek God's Word, for it speaks to you and in you, and this act will ground you in His truth, and will also guide you into seeing God my Father at work. Or put it this way, 'you are an important light bulb, and your life's work is to remain plugged in'! – Prayer.
